HEMOCRAFT SUBJECTS.

Homecraft classes meet as follows :—

Mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon.

Afternoons from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. and
from 2.30 p.m. to 4.30 p.m.

Evenings from 6.30 p.m. to 8.30 p.m.

Classes for City and Guilds Certificates meet in the evenings.

All other classes meet in the mornings, afternoons and evenings.

Day classes operate from September to July, and evening classes from September to Easter, in the sections :—

Dressmaking, Patternmaking, Children's Wear, Lingerie, Tailoring, Embroidery, Needlecraft, Home Furnishings, Cookery, Dietetics, Basic Training for Catering Trade.

Notes for Students :—

- (a) City and Guilds Examinations. The Examinations for which students may be prepared are Dressmaking Preliminary, Ordinary and Teacher's Certificate, Cookery Ordinary and Teacher's Certificate, Tailoring Ordinary and Needlework Ordinary. Entries must be submitted by the prescribed date, and it is the responsibility of intending entrants to do so.
- (b) Needlecraft classes include the following types of crafts : Slipper-making, glove-making, toy-making, embroidery, simple leather work, felt work, etc.

Needlecraft-Leaders Course is intended for craft leaders of Clubs and Guilds, etc.
- (c) Tailoring classes. Students must previously have attended for at least one year at Dressmaking Classes or have a good knowledge of Dressmaking.
- (d) In all Dressmaking Classes block patterns are used as the foundation for all patterns and adaptations. Bought patterns may be used in the Home Dressmaking Classes.
- (e) Lingerie. Underwear and Blouses. Embroidery.
- (f) Advanced Embroidery. (This course is *only* for advanced students. Students will be required to submit previous work before enrolment).

(g) Fees :—

City and Guilds Teacher's Certificate Courses—20/-.
Part-time Day—15/- for each class (September to July).
Evening—9/- for each class (September to Easter).
College Union Fee—payable by all students—1/-.

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COURSE IN BAKERY AND CONFECTIONERY.

Attendance is on one half-day and one evening weekly.

* These courses will not operate in Session 1950-51.

Notes for Students :—

- (a) Students under 16 years of age may be required to take a Preliminary Course on one full day weekly. For particulars, see leaflet No. 10.
- (b) Students take the City and Guilds Intermediate Examination in Breadmaking and Confectionery at the end of the Second Year Course.
- (c) Students take the City and Guilds Final Examinations at the end of the fourth year.
- (d) An additional evening class in Design may be required during the third year course.
- (e) The classes will meet from 2 to 5.30 p.m. on one day and from 6.30 to 8.30 p.m. on one evening.

LADIES' HAIRDRESSING.

Courses for Apprentice Hairdressers are operated in co-operation with the Coventry Master Hairdressers' Association. Applications to be made through the Secretary of the Association, Mr. A. Whithy, 642, Foleshill Road, Coventry.

The course requires attendance on two evenings per week for three years (Sept.-June) and leads to the examinations of the City and Guilds of London Institute and the Institutè of Trichologists.
